This spring holds the promise of another great year of growth and development for Communities Together Inc-and the more than 9,000 residents we serve.

Our <u>award-winning</u> CORES-certified group now provides community and resident engagement services and activities in concert with management teams in 27 family and senior communities located from Baltimore to the DC area and as far west as the Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia.

#### Our community-building Neighbor Up program remains especially popular with the residents we serve. Resident and community management

teams identify community goals and work together to achieve them. Social isolation is replaced by social cohesion. In a "multiplier effect," community members take on personal finance, youth development, career advancement, and better health. These grants and gifts helped us help your neighbors and you in 2024:

\$10,000 from the DC Housing Finance Agency to help fund Neighbor Up

at Metro Village Three Tree Flats and Mills Place in D.C. \$5,000 from HSBC supported Neighbor Up at two family communities in

helps neighbors at Ft. Washington Manor record their life stories as oral histories - like StoryCorps. This is a great new tactic in our efforts to combat social isolation. \$25,000 from Wells Fargo funded our Entrepreneurship program along

with our Financial and Housing Stability program. \$148,600 from Capital One funded a two-year project that provided free

Wi-Fi for all households at Silver Creek Senior Living in Kensington, MD. The grant also funded free Chromebooks for each household as well

as training on the laptops with tips on surfing the web safely. That project

helped seniors combat social isolation and led to similar projects at other communities. An earlier \$10,000 from the Prince George's County's Local Development Council completed a similar project providing Chromebooks and training at

\$50,000 from Oceanside and AHD allowed us to provide rental assistance to residents in Prince George's County and Montgomery County in Maryland.

Ft. Washington Manor, a senior community in Ft. Washington, MD.

\$30,000 – a first-time grant from the Phillip L. Graham Fund in December 2024 for our general operating budget - the best kind of support for our development--along with their introduction to potential partners.

\$5,000 from Montgomery County for 2025 to support our organizational development as we build our technical capacity. We will use it to support our evaluation and reporting improvement project.
